BARANGAY PROFILE

This Barangay is called SANCHEZ, a name that came from Sanchez Mira of Cagayan. Eventually registered as "BARANGAY SANCHEZ" when the rural unit of Government is newly governed by the Barrio Charter Act under the Administration of Barrio Captain Arcadio Castillo and his councilmen. People of the Barrio are most farmers; they plant vegetable and palay. Rice Planting is a major source of income of the people and the place has a aquatic sources. It has a two main line of river the Agno and the Chico River, where sometimes the people fishing during dry and rainy season and has fruit bearing trees like Mangoes, Santol, Jackfruit and others, planted with their respective land.

CLIMATE - There are two distinct climate, the wet (planting season) and Dry (Harvest Season). Wet Season usually start during the month of May up to November and Dry Season starts during the month of December up to April, Although sometimes prolonged at a minimal number of days.

DIALECT - Majority speaks Ilocan, Pangalato, with an occasional use of English and Tagalog.
