EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 002-A, S-2024

RECONSTITUTING THE LOCAL COUNCI REORGANIZING THE MUNICIPAL ANTI-DRUG ABUSE COUNCIL (MADAC) OF THE MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT OF ASINGAN, PANGASINAN AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, the Philippine Constitution mandates that the government shall promote the quality of life of the people. Towards this end, Section 16 of the Local Government Code of 1991 provides that local government units shall pursue undertakings to improve public morals and maintain peace and order, among other equally significant concerns;

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 9165 (RA 9165), otherwise known as the Comprehensive Dangerous Drugs Act of 2002, embodies the National Government's commitment in eradicating the country's illegal drug problem. Article VII of RA 9165 highlighted the important participation of Local Government Units (LGUs) in safeguarding the citizenry from the harmful effects of dangerous drugs through the establishment of Special Drug Education Centers (SDECs), continuous conduct of advocacy activities, and allocation of resources;

WHEREAS, several issuances and directives were issued by the Dangerous Drugs Board (DDB), DILG, and DOH on strengthening anti-drug abuse campaigns, drug-clearing programs, and community-based treatment and support services in barangays, municipalities, and cities;

WHEREAS, the DILG-DDB Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2018-01 entitled Implementing Guidelines on the Functionality and Effectiveness of Local Anti-Drug Abuse Councils provides for cohesion of policies for an enabling environment that will address threats of illegal drugs to health, wellbeing, and national security more effectively to help ensure community peace and harmony;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Engr. CARLOS F. LOPEZ, JR., Municipal Mayor of Asingan, Pangasinan, premises considered, by virtue of the powers vested in me and by expressed authority provided for by law to the Local Chief Executive, do hereby order the reconstitution of the Municipal Anti-Drug Abuse Council (MADAC) with the following stipulations:

SECTION 1. COMPOSITION. The Council shall be composed of the following as members:

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SECTION 2. DUTIES AND FUNCTIONS. The MADAC shall have the following duties and responsibilities:

- a) Attest the certification declaring the 'drug-cleared' status of an affected barangay, certified by the Local Chief of Police and validated by the PDEA Regional Director;
- b) Monitor the BADAC and BAT's names, address, and other significant details, copy furnished the DILG Filed Office;
- c) Receive the consolidated information report from BADAC Chair;
- d) Review the consolidated reports of cluster leaders for final consolidation and submission to PDEA:
- Maintain list of endorsement and referral of Barangay Duty Officer as to who are the drug dependents for screening using the Alcohol, Smoking, and Substance Involvement Screening Test (ASSIST);
- f) Establish one-stop shop facilities where assessment, interview, counseling, referral, and/or processing of applications for petitions for confinement of drug dependents and PWUD who surrendered for treatment and rehabilitation and other allied processes may be undertaken;
- g) Designate a focal person who shall ensure the compliance and drug enforcement of DDB Regulations on Voluntary Surrender of Drug Users and Dependents and shall coordinate with the appropriate service provider to assure compliance with the prescribed intervention;
- h) Ensure that PWUDs who surrendered shall undergo screening in order to determine the level of risk and/or comorbidities and refer them to appropriate intervention;
- Designate certain personnel as the authorized representatives of the DDB who shall cause the processing and filing of petitions for confinement of drug dependents and PWUD who surrendered for treatment and rehabilitation before the Regional Trial Courts pursuant to Section 54 and 61 of RA 9165;
- j) Organize the MADAC Drug Reformation Committee and adopt the Program of Instructions for Drug Reformation Program;
- k) Provide for the Community-based Rehabilitation Program;
 - Lead in the formulation of the plan of action for community-based treatment and support services on the promotion and prevention of drug abuse in communities in coordination with other members of the network of LGU;
 - 2) Monitor all IEC materials on the campaign, "Sa DROGA Talo Ka, ACHIEVE ang PAGBABAGO!" to be adopted by primary care facilities in advocating for the promotion and prevention of drug abuse in communities, as approved by DOH Health Promotion and Communication Service with DOH DDAPTP and concurred in by DDB;
 - 3) Submit the reports of DATA on Community-Based Treatment and Rehabilitation and Data on Drug Treatment, Rehabilitation, and Aftercare of Drug Dependents thru the ADAC-RS as integrated in the Integrated Drug Monitoring and Reporting Information System (IDMRIS) of DDB.
- I) Conduct advocacy and/or preventive education seminars, giving emphasis to the role of parents and children in the anti-drug campaign, ill-effects of drugs, and consequences of drug abuse. This includes the conduct of lectures on the proper procedures of rehabilitation of drug dependents and PWUD who surrendered pursuant to RA 9165 and pertinent DDB Regulations counseling program for families with drug dependents and PWUD who surrendered to cope with the trauma; and
- m) Designate a MADAC Secretariat, who will collate all reports and maintain periodic statistics on barangay drug-clearing operations for evaluation/analysis and continuing enhancement of process and procedures;

SECTION 3. SECRETARIAT. The MADAC Secretariat shall submit all quarterly reports to the PADAC not later than the 10^{th} day of the ensuing quarter, copy furnished the local Peace and Order Council and DILG Field Office.

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SECTION 4. THE ADAC-RS. Hereby adopted the Anti-Drug Abuse Council – Reporting System which shall be used by the **designated Focal Person MICHAEL C. SOLIVEN – LDRRMO I**, to:

- a) Capture profile of PWUD who surrendered, their screening, assessment, and interventions provided using the Community-Based Treatment and Rehabilitation Form; and
- b) Monitor the implementation of community-based treatment programs/services by LGUs, NGAs, and other organizations.

SECTION 5. MEETINGS. The Council shall conduct regular quarterly meetings and special meetings, when necessary, supported by Minutes of the Meetings duly signed by the Secretariat Head, Notices of Meetings, Attendance Sheets, and pictures (if available).

SECTION 6. BUDGET. For the effective implementation, compliance, and monitoring of the activities on anti-illegal drugs, Section VII of MC No. 2009-09 in relation to Sections 46 and 51, Article VI of the IRR of RA 9162, Section 6 of Dangerous Drugs Board Resolution No. 2, series of 2007, and Article VI, Section 115 (B) of DDB Regulation No. 1, series of 2006, is reiterated requiring all concerned LGUs to allocate a substantial portion of their budget to assist in or enhance the enforcement of RA 9165.

SECTION 7. COMPENSATION AND REMUNERATION. The members of the MADAC shall perform their duties as such without compensation or remuneration. Members thereof who are not government officials or employees shall be entitled to necessary traveling expenses and allowances chargeable against the funds of the Council, subject to existing accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

SECTION 8. REPEALING CLAUSE. All orders, rules, regulations, and other related issuances inconsistent with or contrary to this Order are hereby repealed, amended, or modified accordingly. All other provisions of existing issuances which are not affected by this Order shall remain valid and in effect.

SECTION 9. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. In the event any provision in this Order shall be declared invalid, illegal or unenforceable, the validity, legality and enforceability of the remaining provisions shall not be affected or impaired thereby.

SECTION 10. EFFECTIVITY. This Order shall take effect immediately.
